



HANDY HINTS

BORDER CROSSING:



- ◇ A valid passport is needed for entry into Lesotho (valid for 6 months after your date of return to South Africa).
- ◇ Children of all ages are required to travel with a valid passport.
- ◇ Unabridged birth certificates & all required affidavits are necessary if travelling with children.
- ◇ The Caledonspoort border post opens at 06:00 and closes at 22:00.
- ◇ The Ficksburg border post is open 24 hours but adds additional driving time so is not advised unless it can't be avoided.
- ◇ Have cash handy for toll fees at the border post.
- ◇ Visas: South Africans can get a visa stamp at the border. To check if you need a visa please visit: <http://www.foreign.gov.ls/consular/default.php>

TRAVELLING WITH CHILDREN:

- ◇ The law requires an unabridged birth certificate, valid passport and all required affidavits and permissions when travelling with minors under the age of 18 years. For queries or help on this subject please give the office a call.
- ◇ Snacks are available at the Cooler Box or Gondola Café near the slope & please make sure that you drink lots of water.
- ◇ Kids will be hungry and tired after a full day on the slopes in the fresh mountain air. We suggest booking supper early.

VEHICLES:

Please remember to ensure that you meet the following requirements for travel to Lesotho via the Free State:

- ◇ Certified colour copies of your passport and driver's licence.
- ◇ ID and vehicle registration papers (Natis documents).
- ◇ If your vehicle is subject to a financial lease, hire purchase or loan agreement, you will require a letter of authority from the financial institution giving you permission to take it across the border of Lesotho.
- ◇ If the vehicle you're driving is not yours you will require a letter of authority in the form of an affidavit from the registered owner.
- ◇ This is in an effort by SAPS Free State to be proactive in preventing cross-border crimes.
- ◇ Remember to check your licence disc to make sure it's valid past your return date to South Africa.
- ◇ Please ensure your trailer is roadworthy and has a valid licence disc.
- ◇ Ensure you have the correct safety equipment:
 - 2 red triangles
 - 1 fire extinguisher

WHAT TO PACK:

- ◇ Clothing - warm clothes for day and night – even in summer.
 - Waterproof clothing is recommended.
 - Shoes with good tread.
 - An extra set of clothes recommended for day visitors.
- ◇ Sunblock & sunglasses – snow glare is very bright & harsh on eyes & skin in winter, as is the summer sun at altitude.
- ◇ Backpacker guests – your own bedding, towels & cooking utensils if you plan to cook.
- ◇ Self-catering
 - While basic necessities can be purchased at reception, please note that there is no supermarket in the area so please bring your own food and beverages.
 - It is suggested that you keep your shopping receipts in case they are asked for by border officials.
 - Please note that receipts in excess of R1500 per person will need to be declared.
- ◇ There is no alcohol allowance at the border, so we advise you to purchase this from any of the bars at the Resort or stop off at an off-sales in Butha-Buthe before you head up the mountain.
- ◇ We do not recommend braaing in winter but do have braais available for those brave enough to attempt it.



WINTER:



- ◇ Antifreeze for the car.
- ◇ Travel with an extra blanket in case of extreme weather.
- ◇ Clothing – if you look good you ski better!
 - The Resort does not rent out ski/snowboard clothing.
 - You can purchase ski / snowboard attire at Gone Skiing at the Resort or at the outlet in Fourways (which also has second-hand options).
 - Gone Skiing also offers trade-in options on kids clothing purchased from them.

YOUR TRIP:



- ◇ You can find directions to the Resort on our website www.afriski.net
- ◇ Before you travel, please check our website or Facebook page for current weather conditions.
- ◇ Please stay in contact with the Resort in bad weather & if there is snow forecast contact reception or reservations for best times to travel.
- ◇ Make sure your car radiator has antifreeze.
- ◇ We try to advise everyone if it snows and if the passes close. Please do NOT attempt to drive through if you are warned not to.
- ◇ Ensure you fill up before arriving as the nearest petrol station to the Resort is 76km away in Butha-Buthe.
- ◇ Keep to the speed limit. The national speed limit on open roads in Lesotho is 80km/h and in the cities 50km/h.
- ◇ Roadblocks are common practice.
 - Stop behind the stop sign and wait to be called forward.
 - Police will expect to see a valid licence disc, 2 triangles and a fire extinguisher.
 - Be polite and friendly to avoid unnecessary conflict and absolutely NO bribes are to be given.
- ◇ Please drive carefully.
 - The mountain pass is steep and there is always a possibility of ice and snow on the road.
 - There are potholes in a few places.

ON THE MONEY SIDE:

- ◇ All major bank cards are accepted in Lesotho.
- ◇ The local currency is Loti but South African Rand are widely accepted.
- ◇ A R200 cash refundable key deposit is requested at check in.



STAY IN TOUCH:



- ◇ Please save the resort numbers: +266 595 44 734 / +27 87 357 0250.
- ◇ You will need to activate international roaming on your cell phone before you exit South Africa (please contact your service provider at least a week before departure).
- ◇ There is Vodacom 3G signal,

although this can be interrupted by bad weather.

- ◇ You can purchase local SIM cards and data at reception, and we also have a limited number of dongles and routers available for internet access.

MAXIMISE YOUR BOOKING:

- ◇ Check-in time is at 16h00 on the day of your arrival.
 - Some people book into Clarens or a nearby B&B the night before, cross the border early and spend this first day getting your equipment fitted. You may even have time to hit the slopes before checking in.
- ◇ Check-out time is at 10h00 on the day of departure.
 - Pack your car so you are ready and then you can enjoy your last day on the slope.
 - If you need to be down the mountain pass before sundown we suggest you leave the resort by 16h30.
- ◇ Full payment is required one month before arrival or immediate payment if your booking is less than a month away.
- ◇ Please print your booking confirmation for accommodation and skiing and hand in at reception.



SAFETY: On-site medical support during the winter season is provided by EMC.

- ◇ EMC is available for medical assistance for any injuries or illness acquired at the Resort and all costs are for the guest's own account.
- ◇ Please ensure you use guides and instructors, follow their advice and cautions, and follow the slope or activity rules when you're out and about.
- ◇ Inform your medical aid that you will be out of the country to ensure that you are covered.
- ◇ Check with your car insurance that you are covered when travelling out of the country.
- ◇ Ensure you have travel insurance that covers non-arrivals, accidents and additional costs resulting from being snowed in or out of the resort.
- ◇ Remember it's high altitude, and if your blood pressure can't handle it, please bring medication.
